

Job Board CSS Customization Guide for Web Developers

You can customize the look and feel of your Job Board by adding your own styles via Cascading Style Sheets (CSS). Examples of customizations are below.

Headings

You can define the style of the text headings used throughout your Job Board. Headings are defined in HTML on a level from 1 to 6 (h1, h2, h3, h4, h5, h6). For example, the following code will change all page headings to blue, and all sub headings will change to red.

h1 { color: #0000ff; font-family: Verdana; } h2, h3, h4, h5, h6 { color: #ff0000; }

Links

You can define the style of the links on your Job Board. For example, the following code will change all links to green (#00ff00), and make them blue (#0000ff) on hover:

a { color: #00ff00; } a:hover { color: #0000ff; }

Buttons

The main buttons on your Job Board use the CSS class "btn-primary". Use this class to customize the style of these buttons. For example, the following code will change the background of all primary buttons to orange, while changing the background to red oh hover:

.btn-primary { background: #f7941d; } .btn-primary:hover { background: red; }
